

FACULTY POSITION Sociocultural Anthropology NYU Shanghai

NYU Shanghai seeks to fill a tenured or tenure-track position in the field of Sociocultural Anthropology beginning in the Fall Semester of 2015. This is the first of what is anticipated as three to four positions in anthropology at NYU Shanghai. The person in this position will work with other social scientists to develop a broad, interdisciplinary social science program and major in what is currently an undergraduate setting but one that is planned to include a graduate wing over time. We seek an active scholar, theoretically sophisticated and ethnographically grounded. He or she should be able to work well in an interdisciplinary environment and bring experience in curricular and program development alongside their research and teaching. More advanced candidates should have a distinguished publication list, an active research agenda, and a demonstrated record of leadership in collaborative work.

World area and fields of specialization are open, although interest in global/transnational scholarship broadly defined is preferred. Rank is open, although all applicants must have Ph.D. in hand. Applications at the associate or full professor level are preferred. The person holding this position will be affiliated with NYU Anthropology in New York City.

The terms of employment in NYU Shanghai are comparable to U.S. institutions in terms of research start-up funds and compensation, and include housing subsidies and educational subsidies for children. Faculty may also spend time at NYU New York and other sites of the NYU global network, engaging in both research and teaching.

Applications are invited by October 15, 2014 and will be reviewed until the position is filled. To be considered, applicants should submit a *curriculum vitae*, statements of no more than 3 pages each, describing research interests and teaching experience, and electronic copies of representative publications. In the online process, applicants will be asked to enter the names and email addresses of at least three references. Each reference will be contacted to upload a letter of reference. Candidates at the rank of tenured associate professor or above are not required to submit references at this time.
